The R. W. Briggs and Company paving outfit, with a man crew of 150, me 50 trucks or more, a huge concrete mixer, unloading crane and hopper, was brought into Palacios Sunday afternoon as soon as the railroad tracks were clear of the trains handling the homegoing Texas National Guards. The work of unloading was begun early Monday morning and the pouring of concrete on Palacios end of Highway 58 is well under way. Work was begun at Elder's Dairy barn and is coming this way as fast as the road bed can be put in proper condition, concrete mixed and poured.

Seventy-five men were left up on the Monday Noon Bay City side to do some finishing work and when that is completed, they will come down here and work will be done on the road up until midnight every day it is possible to work.
