
# \*Local Un. Fund Drive Nearing \$6,708 Goal

# Sharks After Regional Title

# **High School Office** Robbed, Severely **Damaged Friday**

Assistant Chief Deputy E. T. Miller of the Matagorda County Sheriff Department reports that the force is checking out leads to the burglary of Palacios Senior High School staged sometime last Friday night.

Early Saturday morning Delfeno Galvan, janitor at the school noticed the office door to the Principal's 5 office had been broken into, and phoned Deputy Miller. Miller then phoned for School Principal J. G. Smith and being unable to find him phoned George Holst principal of the Junior High who went with him to open the building.

The safecrackers broke a glass to get into the administrative wing of the building, and using a bar of some sort did a lot of damage to the door facing, lock and door jam to Mr. Smith's office.

In the hall where the vault leated much Hamage was done to the wall where it was suspected a sledge hammer had been used in knocking the handle and facing from the vault door. The front of the vault door was peeled from the top left corner. Entrance to the vault was gained through the fire wall at the bottom of the door.

Unlocked filing cabinets were pried open and much damage extended to them.

An undertermined amount of money was taken, but Mr. Smith estimated that it was in the neighborhood of \$300 received on magainvestigation and dusting for finger prints and taking pictures.
